Attendance

We are working incredibly hard in school to improve attendance and will be introducing some new initiatives to support families with achieving and maintaining excellent levels of attendance in the coming weeks. As a school we are working at achieving at least 95% attendance across the whole school each week – this will put us in line with national data. You can support school in achieving this by encouraging your child to come into school every day. If you are unsure as to whether or not you should send your child in, please don't hesitate to contact Mrs Ramsbottom, Miss Duckworth or myself to ask for advice – I have attached NHS guidance which explains when you should keep your child at home and when you should send them into school. Anglesey Street

Please could I remind all parents, carers and family members who collect children from school or drop them off to be particularly careful if they are driving along Anglesey Street; we are still having problems with people parking unsafely or driving on the kerb. It is incredibly busy on Anglesey Street – particularly at the end of the school day – with many children, parents and prams walking on a vey narrow path. We have contacted the police and the council numerous times to address the issues, however, if everyone worked together to protect our children, the problem would lessen. Therefore, please could I ask parents and carers to park away from school – preferably on Shorrock Lane – and walk the short remaining distance to and from school when dropping off/picking up. I appreciate everyone's efforts to keep our children safe.

Home Reading

We have spoken at length this week in school about our new year's resolutions and many of the children have told me that they are going to try and read more. Reading at home and for pleasure is so important to a child's development – both academic and emotional – and is the single biggest factor in determining a child's success in later life. Please could I therefore ask all parents, carers and wider family members to support their child's development by encouraging them to read more at home – just an additional 10 minutes per day can make a huge difference! 

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over		
Diarrhoes and Vorsiting	48 hours after their last episode		
Cold and Ru-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidence if they've tested positive for COVID-19.		
Impetigo	their sones have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics		
Messies	4 days after the rash first appeared		
Mumps	5 days after the seeding started		
Scables	they've had their first treatment.		
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking artibiotics		
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
